South Dakota Birds

Our trip was eleven days long hunting exclusively in South Dakota; South Central for pheasant, northwest for sharp tail grouse. The first four days were spent hunting pheasant in food plots with men walking and blockers on the sides and the end of the plot. The walkers were using Labrador Retrievers to push the birds to the end of the plot and, in theory, there would be good shooting for all. It was relatively late in the season and, as a consequence, a lot of the roosters had already been taken. This made it necessary to identify the sex of the bird, with the majority of the rising birds being hens. Even with this situation we managed to shoot at least our limit.

The fifth day we had the opportunity to visit Mt. Rushmore. I, seeing it for the first time, was really impressed. It is certainly worth a visit for anyone in the area.

At about the sixth day we were in Red Owl, South Dakota. This village is very close to Sturgis. Here we were going to hunt sharp tail grouse and Hungarian partridge. The sharp tail grouse is the approximate size of a pheasant hen, a bird that I found much more sporting than the pheasant. If I were to go back, I think the sharp tail grouse would be a higher priority than the pheasant. We carried along pointing dogs, but realized these were of marginal value in hunting these two birds.

The scenery in that part of the state was truly breathtaking. When the lyrics, "Home, Home on the Range," were penned, the author surely must have been somewhere in this vicinity.

All in all, we had a great time in spite of missing some easy shots, but making some that made us very proud.
