#### **Natchitoches Meat Pies**

Marcia Calhoun, Calhoun Longhorns, Mansfield, LA.

#### This is an east Texas favorite.

This is good "traveling" food. Take on fishing, hunting or camping trips. Also long drives in vehicle.

These pies freeze well, can be kept in freezer for future snacks, or quick meal. If you don't want to freeze some for future use, consider cutting recipe in half.

#### Filling:

4 pounds ground meat.

(Beef, pork, sausage, feral hog, goat, or venison, your choice, but needs to have enough fat to fry, so some sausage is recommended. Assortment of different meats works very well, but about half of the meat should be pork or sausage.)

4 Tbsp. flour
4 Onions, large, chopped
6 Tbsp. parsley, fresh, chopped
12 Green onions, chopped
Salt and pepper to taste
Cayenne pepper, to taste

Grated cheese, optional

Cook meat in deep skillet until well done. Add flour and brown. Add salt and peppers. Add onions and cook for 3 minutes. Adjust seasonings, then stir in parsley and green onions, and remove from heat. Cool to room temperature or refrigerate until ready to use.

#### **Pastry:**

1 cup shortening (or  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup butter and  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup shortening)

4 cups self-rising flour

4 eggs, beaten Milk, as needed

#### Meat Pies, con't.

Cut shortening into flour. Add eggs and enough milk (about ¾ cup) to make a stiff dough.

Roll dough very thin, very thin. Cut in circles about 4" across (use coffee can as biscuit cutter). Place one heaping tablespoon of cooled meat mixture, and cheese, if using, on one half of pastry circle. Fold the other half over and **seal** the edges by brushing around the perimeter with a little milk and crimping the edges with a fork.

If freezing some for future use. At this point, wrap in waxed paper and place in plastic bag(s) and freeze (uncooked). When ready to use, they can go directly from freezer into oven.

Meat pies are traditionally deep fried, but they are almost as good baked at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until golden brown.

You can also cut pastry into smaller rounds and make appetizer sized snacks that the men in the crowd will enjoy.
