Orange Tapioca Salad

3 cups water

1 package (3 ounces) orange gelatin

1 package (3.4 ounces) instant vanilla pudding mix

- 1 package (3 ounces) tapioca pudding mix
- 1 can (15 ounces) mandarin oranges, drained
- 1 can (8 ounces) crushed pineapple, drained

1 carton (8 ounces approx.) frozen whipped topping, thawed

In a saucepan, bring water to a boil. Whisk in gelatin and pudding mixes. Return to a boil, stirring constantly; boil for 1 minute.

Remove from heat and cool completely, Fold in oranges, pineapple, and whipped topping. Spoon into a serving bowl. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours. Makes about 12 - 14 servings.
