#### **Buffalo Stew**

1 Buffalo (large)\* 2 jack-rabbits Salt and Pepper Spices to taste

Cut buffalo into bite-sized pieces. This will take a while so start early, maybe about 2 months. Place in large caldron. Add enough gravy to cover.

Cook over mesquite-wood fire for 4 weeks, or until you run out of wood, at 350 degrees.

This will serve 1,700 people. If more are expected, 2 rabbits can be added, but this should be done only if necessary, as some people are cranky and do not like to find hare in their stew.

This move of shooting time will stay in place at least until the first week in September, when we will revisit this, and probably go back to the regular 6:00 PM match starting time.






