The Grand Prairie Gun Club (GPGC) hosted a team skeet tournament with the Ellis County Sportsman Club (ECSC) on Saturday August 14, 2010. 3 teams from the GPGC and 2 teams from ECSC showed up on the hot August morning to represent their respective clubs. Both clubs have a similar skeet league based on a team shoot with a handicap system for individual shooters.

The shoot consisted of 4 rounds (100 targets) of skeet per person for each 5 person team. The handicap for each shooter is added to raw scores for each round up to a maximum of 25. The team "Dean and Dead" from GPGC with Donny Penwell, Jim Hunley, Steve Hambrick, David Todd and Mike Gershick took first with a team score of 485.20. "Improved Cylinder" with Don Yeandle, Sandy Yeandle, Robert Nicholas, Bill Weatherby and Andrew Wyer took second betting the third place team from ECSC by 0.03 points. Overall the tournament was a lot of fun and ECSC is planning on hosting a doubles tournament this fall.

Recipe Corner



Picadillo

Source: Flavors, The Junior League of San Antonio
2 pounds lean ground beef or venison
4 Tbsp. Olive oil
2 Onions, chopped
1 Clove garlic, crushed
2 Apples, peeled, cored and chopped
1 (14-1/2 oz.) can tomatoes with onion and green pepper
3 canned jalapeño chilies, chopped
1/2 cup raisins
Salt and pepper to taste
Pinch of ground cinnamon
Pinch of ground Cloves
3 oz. slivered almonds

Optional: Juice from 1 lemon Dash of cayenne 1⁄4 tsp. Oregano 1⁄4 tsp. Thyme MSG Cumin

Sugar

In a large skillet, brown meat in 3 Tbsp. oil. Add onions and garlic and brown. Add remaining ingredients, except the almonds, and simmer for 20 minutes. Sauté almonds in 1 Tbsp. oil until golden; add to other ingredients, and cook 2 minutes.

Serve with Fritos, tortilla chips, or tortillas as a dip. As a main dish, serve over rice.

Picadillo resulted from the merging of Spanish cookery with Aztec cuisine, and with variations is enjoyed throughout Latin America.


