Recipe Corner



ROASTED RACK OF VENISON AND SHALLOTS WITH DRIED- CRANBERRY GRAVY

Venison is best served rare to medium, as it is a very lean meat that toughens and can develop a stronger flavor if overcooked.

The following recipe may also be made with a 2-1/2 lb. beef fillet, or an 8 to 11 rib (3 to 4 lb.) rack of venison, halved to form two 4 to 6 rib racks and any tough membranes (silver skin) trimmed.

- 2 lbs. shallots, trimmed and peeled
- 2 Tbsp. vegetable oil (plus additional for rubbing the venison)
- 1/2 cup beef broth
- 1/2 cup red wine
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 Tbsp. juniper berries (available in the spice section of supermarkets), crushed lightly
- 2 tsp. cornstarch dissolved in 2 tablespoons water
- 1/3 cup dried cranberries (available at specialty foods shops)
- 1 Tbsp. balsamic vinegar

Preheat the oven to 425°F.

In a roasting pan large enough to hold the venison racks without crowding them, toss the shallots with 2 tablespoons of the oil and salt and pepper to taste and roast them in the middle of the oven, stirring occasionally, for 25 to 30 minutes, or until they are golden. Pat the venison dry, season it with salt and pepper, and rub it generously with the additional oil.

Heat a large heavy skillet over high heat until it is hot and in it sear the venison on all sides. Push the shallots to the sides of the roasting pan, stand the venison racks in the middle of the pan,

allowing the bones to rest together, and roast the mixture in the middle of the oven for 23 minutes, or until a meat thermometer registers 125°F, for rare meat. Transfer the racks with shallots to a platter and let them stand, covered loosely with foil, for 15 minutes.

To the roasting pan add the broth, the wine, the water, and the juniper berries and simmer the mixture, scraping up the brown bits, for 5 minutes. Strain the mixture through a fine sieve set over a small saucepan, whisk the cornstarch mixture, and add it to the saucepan with the cranberries, the vinegar, and salt and pepper to taste.

Simmer the gravy, whisking, for 5 minutes.

Cut the venison into individual chops and serve it with the shallots and the gravy.

Serves 6.

2010 World Warm Up Grand Prairie, Texas

The 2010 World Warm Up was held at the Grand Prairie Gun Club on September 17-19, 2010. The shoot was sold out earlier than ever this year and kept a waiting list right up to the date of the shoot! Our annual guests from the UK returned keeping our shoot the international venue it has become. The shoot also pulled shooters from Louisiana, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Illinois, and New Mexico. We sincerely thank all the shooters for coming to our shoot and making it a success.

A new addition to the GPGC facilities is the new sidewalks connecting all the fields. Good weather prevailed and the targets were excellent. We had fifty shooters on Friday for doubles. Brandon Cade shot the high score of 98 which claimed the championship. David Weintraub took Runner Up and Ricky Williams got 3rd (both with 97s).

Seventy-two shooters began with the 12 gauge event Saturday morning. Clear skies and no wind made the targets as good as they get. Four one hundred straights and 8 ninety-nines were posted the board. Bill Myers bested Randy Penwell for Champ and Leonard Holmes took 3rd.

In the 28 gauge, no one was able to string together 100 straight, so 10 ninety-nines went to the shoot off field to determine the winners. The shoot off went a full box with Jack Davis not missing any to win Champ. Chris Simmons went deep into the box before falling out to claim Runner Up. Randy Penwell won 3rd.

And a shoot at Grand Prairie would not be complete without our delicious meals. We are fortunate enough to have members who volunteer (and can cook!) who arrive early to cook a buffet breakfast. This year we had a 'build your own' breakfast burrito bar with eggs and all the fixins' on Saturday and Sunday.
