Delectable Marinated Chicken

Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
 2 Tbsp. low sodium soy sauce
 2 Tbsp. teriyaki sauce
 1 tsp. liquid smoke flavoring
 1 Tbsp. molasses
 1 Tbsp. sesame seeds
 1 Tbsp. brown sugar
 1 tsp. paprika
 1/2 tsp. garlic salt
 1/4 tsp. garlic pepper
 2 tsp. minced garlic
 1/4 cup canola oil
- 8 skinless, boneless chicken thighs

Directions

1. Mix together Worcestershire sauce, soy sauce, teriyaki sauce, liquid smoke, and molasses in a resealable plastic bag until the molasses has dissolved. Add sesame seeds, brown sugar, paprika, garlic salt, garlic pepper, minced garlic, and canola oil; mix well. Coat chicken thighs with the marinade, seal, and marinate for 4 hours in the refrigerator, redistributing the chicken in the marinade occasionally.

2. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium heat.

3. Remove chicken from marinade and shake off excess. Grill on preheated grill until the chicken has reached an internal temperature of 165 degrees F (75 degrees C), and is firm and opaque, about 12 minutes per side. Discard any remaining marinade.

Red, White and Blue Tart

Ingredients

1 18-oz. roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough (20 cookies)

Coarse sugar

- 1 14-oz. can (1-1/3 cups)sweetened condensed milk
- 1/2 cup dairy sour cream or light dairy sour cream
- 1/2 tsp. finely shredded lemon or lime peel
- 1/3 cup lemon or lime juice
- 1 cup fresh blueberries or blackberries
- 2 cups fresh red raspberries or 3 cups fresh\ strawberry halves



1. Preheat oven to 375 deg. F. For crust, generously grease the bottom of an 11x8x1-1/2-inch rectangular tart pan with a removable bottom or an 11- to 12-inch pizza pan; lightly grease sides. With floured hands, pat half of the dough onto bottom and up the side of the pan.

2. For cookies, on a lightly floured

surface roll out the remaining half of the dough to 1/8to 1/4-inch thickness. Using small star cutters, cut into shapes. Place cutouts on an ungreased baking sheet. Reroll trimmings and cut. Sprinkle half with coarse sugar.

3. Bake crust and cookies until golden, allowing 4 to 5 minutes for small cookies and 12 minutes for crust. Cool on a wire rack.

4. For filling, in a mixing bowl combine condensed milk, sour cream, lemon or lime peel, and juice. Stir about 3 minutes or until mixture is thickened. Cover and chill until ready to assemble tart.

5. To assemble tart, loosen and remove sides of pan from crust, if desired. Transfer crust to a platter, leaving bottom of pan under crust. Before serving, spread filling onto crust. Top with berries and cookies. Cut into squares. Makes 12 servings.

* Individual registrations, as in the past, will be accepted by email (SkeetLeague@gpgc.net) or sign-up at the club and will be assigned to a team by league management. The registration fee of \$80 will be due on the first night of the league.

* Whole team registration will enable a benefactor to reserve an entire team of five spaces. The benefactor will be responsible for the team roster, electing a captain (who must be a member in good standing), and naming the team. Anyone interested in registering a whole team

will be required to pay the \$400 registration fee in advance when they sign-up at the club. Please note, no phantom shooters will be allowed on whole-team registrations; five individuals must participate. Whole team registrations will provide management with the five participants names no later than the first night of the league.

We look forward to seeing everyone in September!

Jon McDonald won A1 outright in the Doubles with a 99 and capped that with a shoot-off 100 to win Triple Sub Champ in the 28GA. **C.W. Dagnal** took C1 outright in the Doubles with a 96, while **Jim Speer** won Veteran Champ with a 97 in the .410.

Over in the Crawfish State at the Briley Louisiana Open in Lafayette, LA, **Jim Speer** won VT HOA with a 388, then went on to win VT CH in both the 28GA and .410, with a 96 and a 98, respectively. Oh Jim, "laissez les bon temps roulez!"

Speaking of letting the good times roll, transplanted-to-Texas Pelican Stater and GPGC member **Paul Giambrone** went to the St. Joe Valley Conservation Club's third annual Poco Loco Skeet Shoot and made registered shooting history, shooting the NSSA's first ever 400 in the .410 bore. Let's everybody tip their hat to LPG III for this amazing feat!

At the Texas State Shoot in San Antonio on the weekend of June 22nd, even the experienced registered shooters were begging for a little shade, but a little sun didn't stop GPGC shooters from doing well. Robert Paxton took 3rd place overall, while Robert Nicholas shot his best ever .410 score of 99, and got to duke it out in a shoot-off with skeet legends **Robert Paxton**, John Castillo, Carter Wehrheim and others. Glea Davis won her first ever state Lady title in the 28GA outright with a 98. Other honors were HOA: Robert Paxton, 3rd, SS CH 396, Jack Davis A1 391 and C.W. Dagnal SV CH 370. In Doubles it was Robert Paxton AAA1, SSCH 97, Jim Speer VT CH 94 and C.W. Dagnal SV CH 90. Robert Paxton took 12 gauge SS CH with a 100, and in 20 gauge it was Jim Speer AA1, VT CH 100, Donny Penwell, C1 96 and C.W. Dagnal SV CH 88. Glea Davis, showed her "ladylike ways" taking 28 gauge LY CH with a 98, while the always gentlemanly C.W. **Dagnal** bowed in as SV CH with a 97. Down in the "shooting pencils" .410 bore, Robert Paxton took AAA1 with a 99, Robert Nicholas matched his 99 to take A1, and C.W. Dagnal closed out his winning ways with a SV CH 92.
