Roux is one of the secrets to great gumbo, and the easiest way to make a great roux is in the microwave. No problem taking the grease off later. The other secret that very few people know about is buy your shrimp with shells, boil the shells and add the stock to the gumbo. Below is my recipe best da-n gumbo you will ever eat.

1 cup oil & 1 cup flour. Put in microwave in one minute intervals – whisk in between - until roux at color you want. Put about $\frac{1}{2}$ in big pot (I use 6 quart pressure cooker).

Add:

2 large onions, chopped5 to 6 ribs celery, chopped3 to 4 carrots, peeled and chopped1 large green pepper, chopped

Put all in pot and cook in the roux until tender.

Make stock from shrimp shells, heads, etc. Boil with 3 or 4 cups of water. Add stock to pot.

Add below to taste - measurements are estimates

depending upon taste.

- 1 or 2 cans rotel tomatoes, to taste (run in blender first)
- 1 (14-ounce) can diced or stewed tomatoes (run in blender first)

3 or 4 bay leaves

- 2 tablespoons crab boil seasoning (recommended: Old Bay)
- 1 tsp. crushed red pepper or
- ¹/₄ tsp powdered cayenne pepper
- 2 tablespoons paprika
- 2 tablespoon dried oregano (Mexican is best)
- 2 tablespoon dried thyme
- 2 tablespoon granulated onion
- 3 or 4 tablespoon granulated garlic
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 cup Worcestershire sauce
- 5 beef bouillon cubes
- 2 tablespoons salt (I suggest holding until after bouillon cubes added and tasting first)
- 1/4 bunch flat leaf parsley, stems and leaves, coarsely chopped (if available)

1 (6-ounce) can tomato paste (your choice-I don't use)

Add additional water and roux to your taste for volume and thickness. Cook all above for about 20 minutes.

Then add: 1 pound cut okra, frozen (If you fry the okra off first it will cook off the slime)

Cook above about 10 minutes. Then add (seafood is to your choosing): 1 or 2 pounds shrimp 1 pound scallops 1 pound fish of your choice any other seafood you want to use

Cook 10 minutes and serve over rice.


At this time we are not able to recycle plastic bottles or aluminum cans. These items still need to be thrown away in the blue barrels with regular trash.

* Individual registrations, as in the past, will be accepted by email (SkeetLeague@gpgc.net) or sign-up at the club and will be assigned to a team by league management. The registration fee of \$80 will be due on the first night of the league.

* Whole team registration will enable a benefactor to reserve an entire

team of five spaces. The benefactor will be responsible for the team roster, electing a captain (who must be a member in good standing), and naming the team. Anyone interested in registering a whole team will be required to pay the \$400 registration fee in advance when they sign-up at the club. Please note, no phantom shooters will be allowed on whole-team registrations; five individuals must participate. Whole team registrations will provide management with the five participants names no later than the first night of the league.

The Report from The Registered Line

Greetings skeeter dudes and dudettes. As summer burns up Texas GPGC members have been burning up skeet fields across the USA. At the Morrissey Motor State Shoot in Detroit, MI, **Robert Paxton** turned in an outstanding performance, dominating three other folks (all with 398's) for the HOA. **Paxton** also shot-off to win the 28 gauge, the .410 bore event, and the HAA (496). Outstanding! Meanwhile at the St. Louis Open **L. P. Giambrone** won the HOA with a 399, while besting a dozen perfect scores to win the 20GA shoot off.

Over on the Left Coast GPGC shooters showed that "all the gold in California is [not] in a bank in Beverly Hills." At the California State Skeet Championship in Stockton **Elizabeth Hoskins** and her gun hereinafter known as "Señorita Remo" took 12GA Lady Champion by shoot-off (99) plus 20GA and Lady Champ outright (99). At the Western Open "Mini" in Stockton, CA on 7/20 **L. P. Giambrone** won with a 199 (winning .410, 28GA, & Doubles), and then followed that up in the Western Open "Main" at Stockton by winning HOA with the only perfect 4x100. Last year **L. P.** was one of four at the Western Open who shot 4x100; this year his was the sole perfect score. Congratulations, Paul! **Elizabeth Hoskins** and the Señorita didn't go home from the Western Open empty-handed, taking 12GA, Lady Champion (100 (SO) & B1 (SO). And to make her winning day totally perfect, the squad she was on shot a perfect 5x100 in the 12 gauge.

Those GPGC long gunners who traveled shorter distances also chalked some very nice wins in very hot weather at the combined Terrell and Ellis County Summer Open. This shoot held July 21st and 22nd has shooters compete one day at the Terrell grounds and the other day at Ellis County, allowing shooters to enjoy the hospitality of two great clubs! HOA B1 went to **Richard Kummer** (372) while **Ginny Warren** (362) took LY CH. In both the 12 and 20 GA **Tamme Cervenka** was C1 and LY CH (94, 96), while **Ginny Warren** took D1 in the 20 GA with a 93 and LY CH in 28 GA with a "rocket" 88. In .410 Bore **Randy Walhood** (89) claimed B1, and C1 & SS CH went to **Richard Kummer** (94). **Jay Warren** took D1 (83) and **Ginny Warren** rounded out her winning days with LY CH (89).
