Simple Beer Batter

Coat the meat in regular flour first, pat off excess. Then dredge it in a combo of:

- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1 shiner bock (room temp)
- 1 tsp of salt & pepper

Whisk together while combining AP flour slowly. Make the batter like a runny pancake batter.

Dutch Oven Squirrel

Cut two whole squirrels in half so they fit in a Dutch oven.

Use enough bacon grease in Dutch oven to fry all pieces. I season pretty heavy with garlic salt, pepper, and natures seasoning. When grease is hot put pieces in big ziplock with flour and get em coated good.

Fry all pieces one or two at a time not crowding pan until close to done, you're mostly getting the flour good and brown.

Once they are all cooked, deglaze oven with a cup of chicken broth. Add all pieces back in oven and a little water to almost cover all pieces.

Put lid on and place Dutch oven in a 250-degree oven for a couple hours.

Pull out and add some cut up potatoes and onion and garlic. Back in for another hour or so.

When the broth gets thick from the flour and the potatoes are done the meat will pull off bone, it will be potatoes, gravy, squirrel all in one pot.

St. Patrick's Day Fun Facts

St. Patrick's Day is observed on March 17 because that is the feast day of St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. It is believed that

he died on March 17 in the year 461 AD. It is also a worldwide celebration of Irish culture and history. St. Patrick's Day is a national holiday in Ireland, and a provincial holiday in the Canadian province of Newfoundland and Labrador.

The actual color of St. Patrick is blue. Green became associated with St. Patrick's Day during the 19th century. Green, in Irish legends, was worn by fairies and immortals, and also by people to encourage their crops to grow.

St. Patrick did not actually drive snakes out of Ireland; the snakes represent the pagans that he converted to Christianity.

The very first St. Patrick's Day parade was not in Ireland. It was in Boston in 1737.

In Chicago, on St. Patrick's Day, the rivers are dyed green. Mayor Daley is also of Irish descent.

In Seattle, there is a ceremony where a green stripe is painted down the roads.

Most Catholics attend mass in the morning and then attend the St. Patrick's Day parade.

Shamrocks are worn on the lapel on this day.

In Ireland on St. Patrick's Day, people traditionally wear a small bunch of shamrocks on their jackets or caps. Children wear orange, white and green badges, and women and girls wear green ribbons in their hair

Many young people dye their hair green for the special day.

Many people wear green on this holiday to avoid being pinched.

The phrase, "Drowning The Shamrock" is from the custom of floating the shamrock on the top of whiskey before drinking it. The Irish believe that if you keep the custom, then you will have a prosperous year.

Many bars in the United States, and abroad, serve green beer to celebrate St. Patty's Day.

- 2. Each team shoots 50 skeet and 50 trap targets total of 100 targets per shooter. NSSA and ATA rules apply. Club management will decide any protests.
- 3. For team and individual shoot-offs, the format will be 10 pairs of skeet doubles from stations 3, 4 and 5; and 10 trap targets shot 2 each from each station. If a tie remains, shooters will proceed to the 27 yard line and shoot 2 shots from each station. Any remaining ties will be shot off from the 27 yard line until a winner is determined. Team shoot offs will take place first.
- 4. No shot exceeding 1 1/8 oz, 7 ½ shot will be permitted. If you can't shoot it for ATA trap or NSSA skeet, you can't shoot it.
- 5. Winning club will host the next inter club shoot or may defer it to another club.
