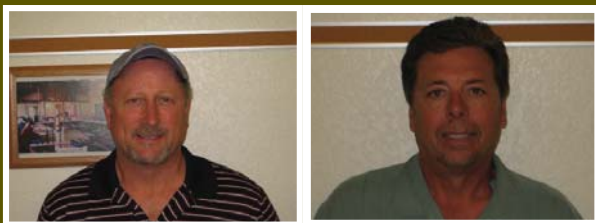

Recipe Corner



Deer Poppers

Ingredients

1 lb venison steak, cubed
1/2 teaspoon all purpose Greek seasoning
1/4 teaspoon steak seasoning
1 (16 ounce) bottle Italian salad dressing
1/2 cup jalapeno pepper, slices
10 slices bacon, cut in half
Toothpick, soaked in water

Directions

1. Season the venison meat with Greek seasoning and steak seasoning. Place in a bowl, and pour in enough Italian dressing to cover. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours to marinate, but preferably overnight.
2. Preheat the grill for medium heat. Drain the marinade from the meat, and discard the marinade. Place a slice of jalapeno on top of a piece of meat, then wrap with a slice of bacon. Secure with a soaked toothpick. Repeat with remaining meat.
3. Grill the deer poppers for 15 to 20 minutes, turning occasionally to brown the bacon. Serve and enjoy!

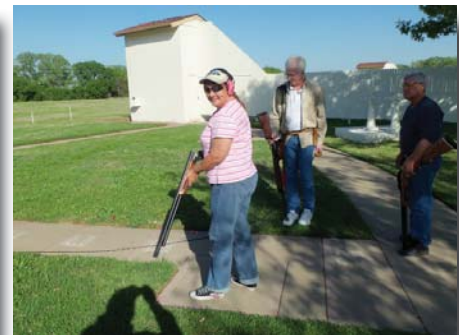

A Grand Prairie Salute to Penny Penwell

What better way to honor a long time veteran of skeet and World War II than to hold a first class skeet shoot? There could not have been a better place to host this event than the Grand Prairie Gun Club. What they lack in size is far outweighed by the effort that this member-owned club puts into an event. If you have never been to this club, you have missed one of the best venues in skeet for targets, food and hospitality.

Upon arrival at the club on Friday, I was amazed to see old 8mm film clips of the history of Penny's shooting career that looked to go back deep into the last century. The gun of choice back then looked to be a Model 12 pump gun that all seemed to use with great proficiency. These pictures also showed the three generation shooting legacy of the Penwell family. Certainly, there have been lots of three generation shooters, but I am talking about all three generations shooting together at the same time. Penny, Randy, Josh and Lonny... now, that is rare. Even though I saw the Ratcliffe family at this shoot, up close and personal, Jeff Ratcliffe about wore me out in the 12-gauge senior shootoff and his son, Jonathan, wore everyone out at the shoot by winning the 410 outright with no shootoff. But the one to watch out for is junior shooter Jake Ratcliffe, who came in third in the 410 event. That's all we need is another talented junior shooter in Texas kicking the old folks around.

We all know that when you go to a shoot in Texas in the spring, there is a good chance you may

be in a high wind situation. Well, a lot of skeet purists tend to stay home, but the tough ones come out to shoot in any condition. The charge into the wind was led by the Captain of the Texas First Team Van Boemer, who won a long shootoff against Pat Byrne for the 12-gauge title. Notable performances were put in by Clay Baldwin in both the 28 and 20-gauge with veteran Richard Karstetter and Jonathon McDonald pushing him all the way. The wind was blowing so hard during the 20-gauge shootoff, competitor Jeff Nekuza was so focused on the moving targets, he had no idea that he won third place, which brought some chuckles from his friends.

There was very little laughter in these shootoffs because of the severe movement of the targets. I think the quote from Shakespeare that "he who jests at scars never felt a wound" came into play, as there were a lot of wounded in the crowd of spectators. Nothing but respect was shown for those that showed up for the HOA shootoff, Pat Byrne, CH, Jonathon McDonald, RU, Clay Baldwin and Van Boemer.

Skeet is a different game depending on the conditions and I have learned to respect those that don't drop out more than those that pander to the benchrest game (conscientious chicken).

That brings me back to my closing story about Penny Penwell and some of his old shooting buddies. Back when I was President of TSSA, Randy Penwell came to me with a request to lower the required

targets for the Veteran and Senior Veteran All State Team. His fear was that his dad was so competitive, that he was going to kill himself getting these targets in the hot Texas sun. Of course, I said I would take care of that issue for him. Well, word of the impending change leaked out, and, as I was walking to the board meeting, I was met by a stern looking group, consisting of Penny, Charlie Hallman, Al Topham and other vets. The verbal fusillade that was directed at me actually loosened some of their denture work, to where it looked like a scene out of the "Alien" movie. I could not remember all that was said to me, but I did remember a few key points. Amidst some comments about my family lineage,



I distinctly remember them saying nobody was going to tell them how many targets they could shoot, certainly not some young, punk TSSA President (I was 54.) Needless to say, there was no motion made to lower the target requirements, as I was convinced that these guys were tough enough to handle anything on or off the skeet field.

With all that said, everyone is looking forward to another Penny Penwell shoot next year.

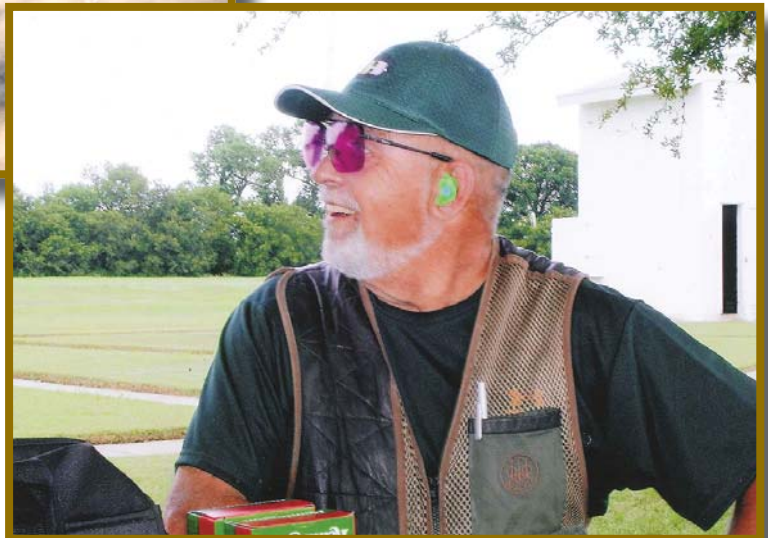
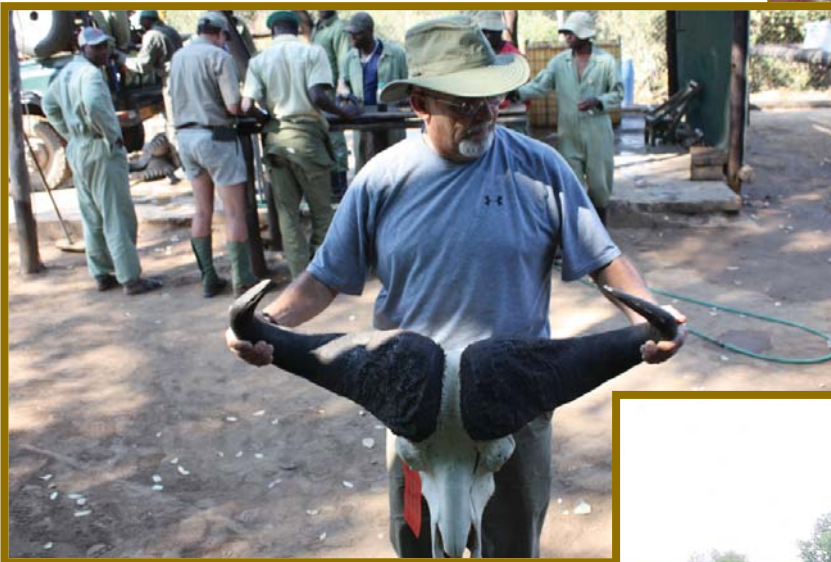
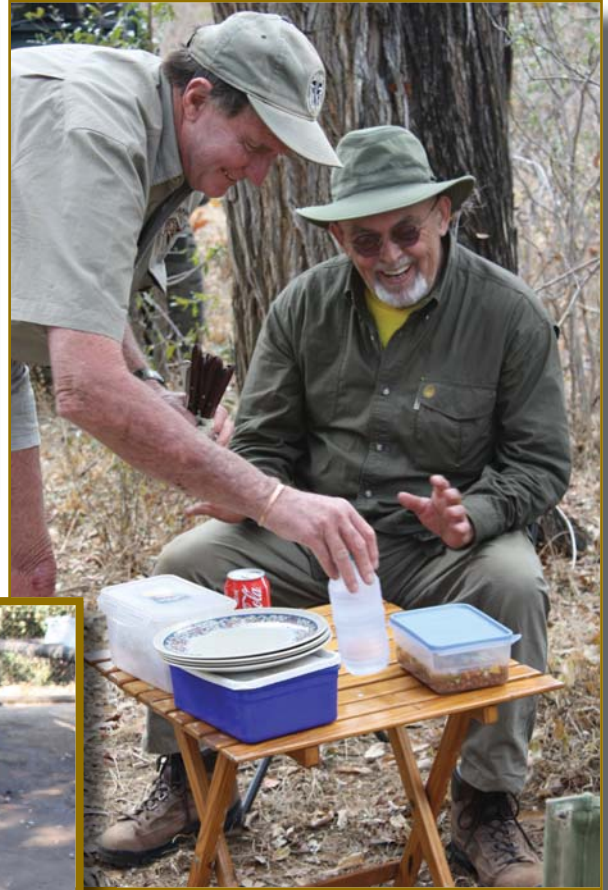

Work Party

The workers this morning, April 6, 2013, were:

Mike Bromhall (drove the skid-steer)	Dan Brown

Mike Horton had his work truck there and supplied the users with 120 V to run drills and saws. He also used his arc blow gun to burn holes in a steel column to allow bolting the tie to the steel column. For a short while some creosote started burning because of the flame coming thru the steel's hole. A squirt bottle fashioned by Jim Wilson put out the fire. Mike Horton said the creosote dripping on his arm wasn't really fun...when he was burning the hole in the steel column.

Mike Bromhall, a new member, had his skid-steer, and used it to erect the ties that had been bolted together.

The pictures show that the plywood holding the gravel is badly perforated! And later we will need to pour some gravel in from the top when the bottom has been made less porous. There is probably 25 pounds of gravel under where Mike was doing the work on the 15 yard baffle.

We succeeded in replacing the RR ties that were badly shot up - that protect the overhead baffle support poles - replaced properly.

We have ~ 12 usable RR ties for other uses, located on the concrete pad besides the pistol range. They were moved over from in front of the pistol range pad by Mike Bromhall with his skid-steer, and Jim Grabbe and Jim Wilson wrestled them onto the skid-steers' forks and then into final place after Mike B had carried them around the other side with the skid-steer. This moving of the ties was done so that when the graveling of the parking lot and the road thru the pistol and rifle range area is done, they would not be in the way.

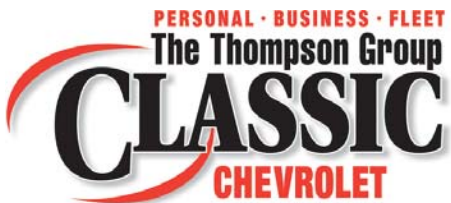
