Recipe Corner



Mustard- Rubbed Ribs

INGREDIENTS

Mopping Sauce

- 1½ cups cider vinegar
- 2 tbsp. ketchup
- 2 tbsp. prepared yellow mustard
- 1 tbsp. light brown sugar
- 1 tsp. red pepper flakes

Dry Rub

- 2 tbsp. kosher salt
- 2 tbsp. chili powder
- 2 tbsp. hot or smoked paprika
- 1 tbsp. freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tbsp. dry mustard
- 1 tbsp. light brown sugar
- 1 tbsp. ground cumin
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp. onion powder
- 1 tsp. ground allspice
- 5 lbs. beef short ribs, or 1 slab spareribs, rinsed, cleaned, and patted dry

To make the sauce combine the vinegar, ketchup, mustard, brown sugar, and red pepper flakes in a lidded jar. Shake vigorously and refrigerate overnight.

To make the dry rub mix the salt, chili powder, paprika, pepper, dry mustard, brown sugar, cumin, garlic powder, onion powder, and allspice in a small bowl.

Rub the spice blend firmly into the surface of the ribs. Wrap the ribs in plastic and refrigerate overnight.

Place coals on one side of a grill and set a drip pan on the other side. Set the rack 6 to 8 inches above the coals, and light the coals.

When ready to grill, you should be able to hold your palm over the coals for about 2 seconds, and there should be a light ash coating on the glowing coals.

Place the ribs on the grill opposite from the coals, and cover. Cook for 20 minutes, keeping the temperature at 200° to 225°F. Brush with the sauce, cover, and continue to cook, brushing with the sauce every 30 minutes, and covering between moppings, for 3 hours or until the bones move slightly when twisted.

Slice between the ribs and serve with any remaining sauce.

For years there was a \$5,000 purse that would go to anyone who could shoot a 30-straight – a perfect score – at a US Hélice Association event. No-one did! Finally, in 2012 Weldon Nichols did it and took the purse. While the elusive perfect score had been attained, it wasn't to become a regular occurrence – and then it happened four times during the 2013 United States Hélice Association National Championship.

Kevin Keetch, Larry Romine, Rich Roberson and Jerry Steadham all shot 30 straight over the course of the September 13-15 weekend at the Dallas Gun Club hosted National Championships, a testament to the skill of the growing number of Hélice shooters in the US. They weren't

the only high scores, however, as over 50 of the best Hélice shooters in the nation battled for the national title.

In Friday's 'Waltz Across Texas' preliminary event, shooters shot a 30 bird race, attempting 10 birds from 5 meters left of the traditional shooting station, 10 birds from 5 meters right of the traditional shooting station and 10 birds from the traditional shooting station the center of the Hélice ring. At a four-way shoot-off between Job Stafford, Rich Roberson, Andy Stahl and Jerry Steadham with scores of 27, Stafford was awarded the Silver Coin and title of Champion for the day's event. Shea Self shot an impressive 29 to take the Ladies award and Jimmy Powell shot a 27 to win Super Veterans.

**Streamlined Texas Hunter
Education Process Takes Effect**

AUSTIN – Beginning Thursday, September 19, hunters who need to complete the state's required hunter education will have expanded contemporary options designed to be more convenient, flexible and accessible.

Anyone born after Sept. 1, 1971, must successfully complete a hunter education training course or purchase a one-time deferral good for one license year in order to hunt legally in Texas. The certification is valid for life and is honored in all other states and provinces.

The new options for hunter education certification include a streamlined, one-day basic course and an option for anyone 17 years of age or older to take the hunting safety training completely online. The combination online home study and 4 to 5 hour skills field day course will still be offered, as well as advanced hunter education and in high school and college courses across the state.

The basic course will introduce and demonstrate skills focused on essential core competencies of safe, legal and ethical hunting.

Since mandatory hunter education first started in 1988, the number of hunting accidents and hunting fatalities has steadily declined to less than 3 per 100,000 hunters. Few accidents involved those who had completed hunter education.


